

South East Alvis Day at Michelham Priory

Held on 10th September 2022

The South East Section held their Alvis Day on Saturday 10th September at Michelham Priory House and Gardens. A Tudor house set on a picturesque moated island, complete with medieval gatehouse and watermill.

The Priory is the site of a former Augustine Priory in Upper Dicker, East Sussex, England, United Kingdom. The surviving buildings are owned and administered by the Sussex Archaeological Society and are Grade I and Grade II listed.

It was decided after the very sad news of the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the Thursday evening, to continue with the event. Especially as the Duke of Edinburgh had an Alvis. The weather held and the turn out of Southern members from East and West was excellent.

On the day, 28 cars arrived, with 56 AOC Members attending. Pre and Post War cars were parked up on the lawns in front of the Priory. Everyone had to drive over the moat and through the iconic gatehouse and into the grounds.





Michelham Priory was founded by Augustinian canons in 1229, the site is steeped in history. During Tudor times the site suffered destruction caused by the dissolution of the monasteries, and in WWII it was home to evacuees and the Canadian Army.

A T-shaped stone-built structure, the East and North wings date from the 13th century and the West wing from the 16th century. The North wing, originally the Prior's Lodgings, comprises three storeys with an attic and the other two wings, two storeys. In seven acres of beautiful grounds there are buildings to explore including: a great barn; medieval gate house; watermill; and the kitchen, physic and medieval herb gardens. The whole site is surrounded by a moat.



The day flowed very nicely with everyone enjoying the lovely surroundings on a lovely day in September, tucking into picnics, checking out the array of Alvises, getting under the bonnet and watching the ever present ducks.
